

Medications and Medical History information stored in CaseTrakker on this screen is listed as "self-reported." Information can come from the member, the PCP (via the History & Physical) or from the Care Manager (via the Comprehensive Assessment). You can also use this screen to note whether the member is compliant with their medications, if they have lost a caregiver, and to see any self-reported procedures that would not otherwise be captured by a THP SCO authorization.

Self Reported Meds includes Medication names entered in a free-text field, with free-text and drop-downs to record Dose, Route and Frequency, which are all required fields. There is a drop-down to note the Associated Diagnosis for this medication, and another drop-down to note whether the medication is OTC/Herbal. These two fields are optional, along with the Notes field, but should be populated as applicable. The Status field is populated with a drop-down to select Active (member is currently taking), Inactive (member has stopped taking) or VOID (for a mistaken entry ONLY). You may use the filter button to filter by any field in the medication list.

The Medical History field is not commonly in use, but can be used to include additional details for Self Reported Diagnoses (in the next section). In this section, each confirmed diagnosis can be marked with a Status of Active (member is currently diagnosed), Inactive (member has recovered) or VOID (for a mistaken entry ONLY). There is a yes/no drop down to indicate if the diagnosis is Stable, and Notes section for important information regarding the member's specific diagnosis or history.
